If high-density building is allowed on the 164 annexed property, it will negatively impact the air quality from the increased traffic in and around the Towns of Woodbury, Harriman, Monroe and Blooming Grove. The health of the children in the Monroe-Woodbury schools located on Route 32 should be a major concern.

Traffic increases substantially when commemorative anniversaries are observed in Kiryas Joel. Increases to population on 164 acres would compound the problem.

Changing our environment to accommodate new people moving to this area would negatively impact the rural community lifestyle of the people who live here (I'm a 30 year resident). Anyone looking for city amenities like municipal sewers, sidewalks and street lights should move to one of Orange County's cities—or not live in Orange County.

Let's wait for the DEC to rule on the 507 acres annexation before pushing through this carve out. They have gathered the data necessary to make a decision. Why start the process all over again?
