Attached are also photographs of the portion of Seven Springs road along which our two major long-distance trails, the Long Path and Highlands Trail, travel; which would be unacceptably and permanently altered should this annexation succeed.

Hikers and walkers would no longer be able to safely continue to follow the trails through a dense development, which would additionally blight the neighborhood and surrounding park landscape. Additionally, these trails form part of a greenway connecting local state parks, creating important wildlife migration corridors, to maintain the genetic health of species in our increasingly developed landscape.

We strongly urge a reconsideration of this proposed annexation, and propose preserving this land on which these trails depend for safe access and a great outdoor experience.
